SHIRES CHILTERN & THAMES RIDER MAGAZINE SHOWING QUALIFIERS – for CHAMPIONSHIPS on 14th September 2008 at Herts County Showground, Redbourn, Herts

RULES

- Horses and Ponies that have qualified for or competed at HOYS (Horse of the Year Show) Royal International or Olympia in the years 2006, 2007 or 2008 are not eligible for the Shires Chiltern & Thames Rider Championships. This Championship is aimed at keen and competitive amateurs, not professionals. This includes non-qualifier classes at RIHS also.
- All people wanting to qualify must be a Member of Chiltern & Thames Rider and must enter their membership number on this show's Entry Form if they wish to try to qualify in the classes.
- CHILTERN & THAMES RIDER DECIDE WHO QUALIFIES when they receive the Result Sheets from this Show
- Please do not enter qualifier classes if your horse or pony is not eligible. You will be spotted! For the past two years, Chiltern & Thames have had to disqualify a horse or pony which is embarrassing for all concerned and also causes problems.
- When shown in-hand, ALL Stallions / Colts must be bitted.
- Stallions must be handled and ridden by people who have attained their 14th birthday on 1st January 2008.
- All ridden horses/ponies must be 4 years old and over.

RING 1 (In-Hand Classes)

START 9am

CLASS 1 **YOUNGSTOCK IN-HAND C & T Qualifier**
Yearlings born during 2007. Any breed or type.

Class 2 **YOUNGSTOCK IN HAND C & T Qualifier**
Two-year olds born during 2006. Any breed or type.

CLASS 3 **YOUNGSTOCK IN-HAND C & T Qualifier**
Three-year olds born during 2005. Any breed or type

★ **MINI CHAMPIONSHIP (A)** **Winners only from classes 1, 2 and 3**
Small cup to winner.

CLASS 4 **BEST CONDITION IN-HAND – GRASS KEPT**
Any breed, type or age. To be kept at grass all year.

CLASS 5 **BEST CONDITION IN-HAND - STABLE KEPT**
Any breed, type or age. To be kept stabled or part stabled.

CLASS 6 **MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND IN-HAND C & T Qualifier**
Registered and Unregistered Small Breeds : Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Welsh Sections A & B

CLASS 7 **MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND IN-HAND C & T Qualifier**
Registered and Unregistered Large Breeds : Highland, Connemara, New Forest, Fell, Dale. Welsh Sections C & D

★ **MINI CHAMPIONSHIP (B)** **Winners only from classes 4 5 6 7**
Small cup to winner

CLASS 8 **RIDING HORSE IN-HAND C & T Qualifier**
For horses 14.2hh and above. This is for horses of Riding Horse Type. Open to mares, geldings and stallions. May be split at finals into heights.

CLASS 9 **HUNTERS IN-HAND**
Hunter type, Lightweight (capable of carrying up to 12st 7lbs) Middleweight (capable of carrying 12st 7lbs to 14st) and Heavyweight (capable of carrying more than 14st). Mares or geldings 4 years old and over. Judged on conformation, walk, trot and overall manner.

RING 1 (In-Hand Classes) continued.....

CLASS 10 **COLOURED IN-HAND C & T Qualifier**
For Skewbald and Piebald horses and ponies only. All heights. Open to mares, geldings and stallions. (Class may be split at the final into the different heights).

CLASS 11 **ODD COLOURED IN-HAND C & T Qualifier**
For Palominos, Duns, Appaloosas, Roans, Spots, Paints, Creams. All heights. Open to mares, geldings and stallions.

CLASS 12 **PURE & PART BRED ARABS IN-HAND C & T Qualifier**
Open to horses and ponies, mares, geldings and stallions. (Class may be split at finals into pure and part-breds)

CLASS 13 **SHOW COBS IN-HAND**
Open to all Cobs – light, middle and heavy. Up to 15 hands. Mares or geldings.

CLASS 14 **VETERAN IN-HAND C & T Qualifier**
For horses and ponies aged 15 years and over. (This class may be split at the finals between horses and ponies and/or age i.e. 15-20 years and 21 + years)

★ **MINI CHAMPIONSHIP (C)** **Winners only from classes 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14** **Small cup to winner**

★★ **IN-HAND CHAMPION** **Open to all winners of the Mini Championships from (A) (B) (C) to compete for medium sized Cup**

RING 2 (Ridden Classes)

START 9am

CLASS 15 **RIDDEN COLOURED C & T Qualifier**

For Skewbald & Piebald horses & ponies only. All Heights. Open to mares, stallions and geldings 4 years old and over. Judge may ride the horses. At the finals, class may be split between horses and ponies.

CLASS 16 **RIDDEN ODD COLOURED C & T Qualifier**

Open only to Roans, Spotted, Appaloosa, Duns and Palominos, Paints and Creams. All heights. Mares, geldings and stallions 4 years old and over. Judge may ride the horses.

CLASS 17 **RIDDEN PURE & PART BREDS ARABS C & T Qualifier**

Open to horses & ponies 4 years old and over, mares and geldings. Judge may ride horses.

CLASS 18 **RIDDEN WARMBLOODS C & T Qualifier**

Open to pure and part-bred Warmbloods, 4 years old and over. . Open to mares, stallions and geldings and any height. Judge may ride horses.

CLASS 19 **RIDDEN HUNTER 15hh and over. C & T Qualifier**

Mares or geldings, 4 years old and over. Judge may ride.

CLASS 20 **RIDING HORSE 14.2hh and over. C & T Qualifier**

Mares or geldings, 4 years old and over. Judge may ride.

CLASS 21 **RIDDEN COB 14.2hh and over C & T Qualifier**

Mares or geldings, 4 years old and over. May be shown with hogged, plaited or un-plaited manes. Judge may ride. May be split at finals 14.2hh-15hh and 15.1hh and over.

CLASS 22 **PONY CLUB PONY C & T Qualifier**

Ponies not to exceed 15hh. Mares or geldings., 4 years old and over, that make good all-rounders for Pony Club activities. Riders not to have reached their 25th birthday. May be asked to jump a small fence.

CLASS 23 **RIDING CLUB HORSE C & T Qualifier**

For horses exceeding 15hh. Mares or geldings, 4 years old and over that make good all-rounders for Riding Club activities. May be asked to jump a small fence.

★ **MINI CHAMPIONSHIP (D)** **Winners only of classes 15 16 17 18 19
20 21 22 & 23** Small cup to winner

Ring 2 continued.....

CLASS 24 **LEADING REIN PONY C & T Qualifier**

Ponies 12hh and under. Riders aged 8 years and under at date of final. Plain snaffle bridles only with plain nosebands and lead to be connected to noseband. Ponies may be plaited or un-plaited and will be split at finals into plaited and M & M.

CLASS 25 **SHOW PONY C & T Qualifier**

Riders up to 17 years of age. Ponies 12,0hh to 14.2hh (will be split into rider ages and pony height at finals) and 4 years and over. Open to mares and geldings.

CLASS 26 **FIRST RIDDEN C & T Qualifier**

Riders 10 years old and under by date of final. Ponies 12.2hh and under and 4 years and over. Ponies to be shown in snaffle bridles and plain nosebands. Ponies may be plaited or un-plaited. (will be split at final between plaited and M&M). Riders from Class 24 are not eligible for this class.

CLASS 27 **SHOW HUNTER PONY C & T Qualifier**

Ponies 12hh to 15hh. Riders from Class 24 are not eligible for this class. Rider ages up to 20 years of age. (Class will be split into rider ages and pony heights at finals). Open to mares and geldings 4 years and over.

CLASS 28 **RIDDEN MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND SMALL BREEDS C & T Qualifier**

Open to riders of any age. Ponies registered and un-registered. Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Welsh Section A and B. Open to mares, geldings and stallions aged 4 years old and over. Leading reins not permitted.

CLASS 29 **RIDDEN MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND LARGE BREEDS C & T Qualifier**

Open to riders of any age. Horses/Ponies registered and un-registered. Highland, Welsh Section C and D, Connemara, New Forest, Fell and Dale. Open to mares, geldings and stallions aged 4 years and over. Leading reins not permitted.

★ **MINI CHAMPIONSHIP (E)** **Winners only of classes 24 25 26 27 28
and 29.** Small cup to winner

RING 3 (Utility Classes)

START 9am

CLASS 30 FAMILY PONY – RIDDEN

Riders any age. Ponies over 13.2hh and suitable for any member of the family (weight permitting). To be judged on suitability, manners and individual show. To be shown in snaffle bridges only.

CLASS 31 BEST TURNOUT RIDDEN

To be judged 50% Horse and 50% Rider. Riders may be led. Competitors in this class may not enter Class 32.

CLASS 32 BEST HACKING TURNOUT RIDDEN

To be judged 50% Horse and 50% Rider. Riders may be led. Horses/Ponies not to be plaited. Competitors in this class may not enter Class 31.

CLASS 33 RIDDEN VETERANS C & T Qualifier

For horses and ponies aged 15 years and over. Mares and geldings. (Class may be split at finals into 15-20 yrs and 21+ yrs and/or heights)



MINI CHAMPIONSHIP (F) Open to winners of Classes 30 31 32 and 33 Small cup to winner

CLASS 34 PRETTIEST MARE IN-HAND

Horse or pony, any size, age or type.

CLASS 35 MOST HANDSOME GELDING IN-HAND

Horse or pony, any size, age or type.

CLASS 36 FANCY DRESS

Open to any age of rider and any horse/pony. May be led. Riders MUST wear correctly fitting hard hats to current standards (as per Rules and Conditions) as part of their costume.

RING 4 (Main Show Jumping Ring)

START 9am

CLASS 37 MINI NOVICE JUMPING

Horse and rider combination not to have been placed 1st in any jumping competition. Height 2' 3" approx. in the first round. Table Two Phase

CLASS 38 NOVICE JUMPING

Horse and rider combination not to have won £30 in any jumping competition. Height 2' 6" approx. in the first round. Table Two Phase

CLASS 39 RIDING CLUBS v PONY CLUBS PAIRS TEAM JUMPING

No restrictions. Both members of the pair enter arena together. First member jumps the course and after the last obstacle, passes baton to second member who then jumps the course. If the first member is eliminated, second member must finish the course at the point the first member was eliminated before starting their own round. Dropped batons must be retrieved before continuing. Judged on time from first member starting to second member crossing the finish line + faults. Height approx. 2' 6" **£14.00 Entry Fee per Pair**

CLASS 40 INTERMEDIATE JUMPING

Horse or Pony not to have won over £60 in show jumping competitions. Height approx. 2' 9" in the first round. Table Two Phase

CLASS 41 SMALL OPEN JUMPING

No Restrictions. Height approx. 3' 0" in the first round. Table Two Phase

CLASS 42 OPEN JUMPING

No restrictions. Height approx. 3' 6" in the first round. Table Two Phase

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. No claims will be entertained for anything which may happen to Competitors their servants, onlookers , horses , vehicles or property in that each entrant shall indemnify the Organisers and Mr & Mrs C Davies against any legal action arising from any mishap.
2. Dogs must be on leads at all times.
3. Riders must wear correct riding attire in all ridden classes. This must include a correctly fitted Hard Hat with three point fastening secured complying with BSI Standards PAS 015, BSEN1384 or ASTM F1163. We recommend that Back Protectors be worn when jumping.
4. No horses or ponies under 4 years of age to be ridden on the show ground.
5. Jumping classes judged under B.S.J. A. RULES.
6. The Judges decision is final in all events.
7. The Organisers reserve the right to refuse or reject any entry and withdraw or amend any prizes offered or cancel a class at their discretion.
8. No entry fee will be refunded unless a class is cancelled or a Doctors or Veterinary Surgeon's Certificate is produced dated no later than 14th July 2008
9. Any queries or complaints must be in writing and handed to the show secretary within 15 minutes of the incident together with a fee of £15.00 which will be refunded if the objection is upheld.
10. Entries may be limited in all classes.
11. Rosettes will be awarded to 6th place.
12. Competitors / grooms are requested to ride sensibly at all times.

THIS YEAR'S CHARITIES BEING SUPPORTED

Bucks Association for Blind & Partially Sighted People

B.A.B. is a local Charity in Aylesbury that helps those with serious sight loss in the local community. Losing your sight can be a traumatic experience and B.A.B. help people to cope and re-build their lives so that they can retain their independence, dignity and self-worth. There are over 5,000 visually impaired (VI) people in Bucks and one person in 60 will suffer visual impairment. Recent research shows this will increase to one in 20 within the next 15-20 years. As you reach retirement age there is a 1/10 chance that you will lose your sight through age related illness. B.A.B. have Rehabilitation Officers who assess and identify the needs of VI individuals, Community Workers who support some of our most vulnerable members and there is a Resource Centre in Aylesbury where VI people can come and try out specially adapted equipment like talking microwaves and speaking clocks. There are also Social Clubs who supply interaction. **Volunteers** play a huge role in B.A.B. as drivers to VI people, home visiting and helping at the Social Clubs, and Bowling Clubs, assisting with IT support and helping to fundraise. Cystic Fibrosis Wycombe Hospital's Children's Ward

Cystic Fibrosis is the UK's most common life-threatening, inherited disease and affects more than 7500 babies, children and young adults. **Symptoms** can include poor weight gain, troublesome coughs, repeated chest infections, salty sweat and abnormal stools. Cystic Fibrosis is a genetic disease that affects a number of organs in the body (especially the lungs and pancreas) by clogging them with thick, sticky mucus. At present there is no cure for CF, but the faulty gene has been identified and doctors and scientists are working to find ways of repairing or replacing it. One of the main objectives of the CF Trust is to fund this work. People with CF are living longer than ever before. Until the 1930s, the life expectancy of a baby with CF was only a few months. Today the average life expectancy for someone with CF is around 31 years.

Chilterns Prostate Cancer Support Group

Prostate cancer generally affects men over the age of 50, and is rarely found in men under that age. Around 30,000 men in the UK are diagnosed with prostate cancer each year. It differs from most other cancers in the body, because small areas of cancer within the prostate are very common and may stay dormant for many years. About one-third of men over the age of 50 have some cancer cells

within their prostate and nearly all men over the age of 80 have a small area of prostate cancer. Most of these cancers grow extremely slowly and so, particularly in elderly men, will never cause any problems. In a small proportion of men, the prostate cancer can grow more quickly and in some cases may spread to other parts of the body, particularly the bones. Prostate cancer often grows very slowly and most men with this cancer live their normal life span without it causing them any problems. The Chilterns Prostate Cancer Support Group helps those who have been diagnosed and helps them to cope.

24 Hour Blood Pressure Monitor for Wooburn Green Surgery

This is a way of recording a person's blood pressure over a 24-hour period. This is a very straight-forward procedure with no side effects. It will provide the doctor with certain important information about a patient's blood pressure as they carry out their normal daily activities. Sometimes when you attend your doctor or the outpatient department at the hospital, your blood pressure is higher than normal. This blood pressure monitoring device allows the doctor to see your blood pressure readings while you are relaxed in your own environment. It is also done to check that any prescribed medication is controlling a patient's blood pressure. The surgery is in need of such a monitor and with a donation from this show, this dream can become a reality.
